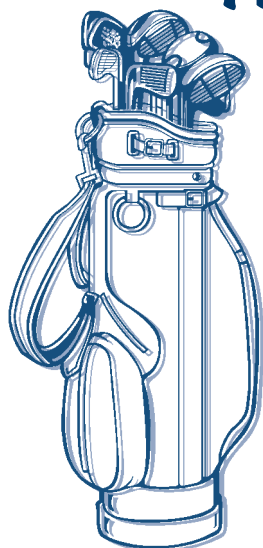
### Gift Of Life Donor Program
