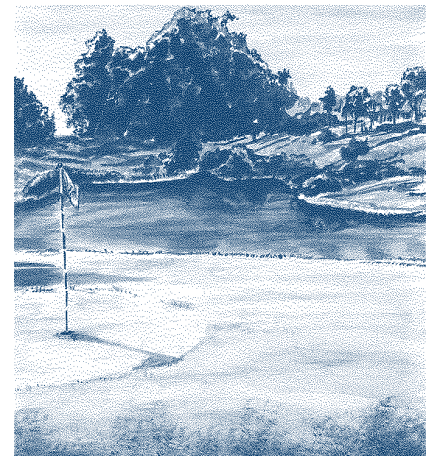

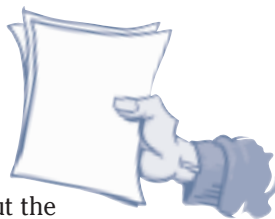

Delaware Valley Science Fairs - Awardees

The Delaware Valley Science Fairs, Inc. was founded in 1949 by The Franklin Institute and The Philadelphia Inquirer, making it one of the oldest Fairs in the country. It is now one of the largest. The Fairs were designed to stimulate interest in science and technology among students in middle and high schools in the tri-state area.

The PDE awards a savings bond to the top three winners in the medicine/health category in each of the five fairs, 6th, 7th and 8th grades is one fair, and 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grades the other four. Jim Rhodes, PDE President and Mike Glennon, Scholarship Committee Chairman presented a scroll and the bond gift certificate to each of the fifteen winners at the Awards Ceremony on April 11th.

The top medal winners selected from the five fairs go on to compete with other regional winners in the United States and thirty other countries.
